Fulfill Your Obligations as a Mandatory Reporter of Child Abuse and Neglect

Why am I required to report child abuse and neglect (child maltreatment)?

- ◆ Executive Order 54, issued by the Governor, makes all UW Extension employees and volunteers mandated reporters.
- ◆ All 4-H volunteers MUST report if they observe or hear about suspected or threatened child maltreatment in the course of their volunteer duties.

What is child maltreatment?

- Physical abuse is physical injury inflicted on a child by other than accidental means.
- Sexual abuse is sexual intercourse or touching of a child, sexual exploitation, forced viewing or listening to sexual activity.
- Emotional abuse is harm to a child's psychological or intellectual functioning.
- ◆ Neglect is the lack of the necessary care, food, clothing, medical or dental care, or shelter, which seriously endangers the physical health of the child.
- ◆ It is child abuse to manufacture methamphetamines with a child present, in a child's home or under any circumstances that the manufacture would be noticed by a child.

Who do I call to make a report?

- ◆ If the child is in immediate danger, call 911.
- ♦ Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.: Rock County Child Protective Services, 608-757-5401
- Evenings and weekends: Rock County Sheriff's Department, 608-757-8000 or local law enforcement; ask to speak to the child protective services after hours worker.

What do I report?

- Describe the nature of the suspected or threatened child maltreatment.
- ◆ Include information that has been disclosed by the child, the person from whom you learned about the maltreatment and/or observed by you.
- Give the name, address and phone number of the child and his/her parents or caregiver.
- Even if you don't have all the information, call and report what you do know.

THE BOTTOM LINE

ALL 4-H volunteers are required to report suspected or threatened child maltreatment.

When you report, give as much information as you can.

If you suspect or learn about something, make the call!
