# Happy New Year!



# Time to start planning and setting your goals for the 2019-20 4-H year. Challenge yourself and try something new!

- ✓ Ask a leader or a 4-H friend about a new project area that sounds interesting.

- ✓ Check out the project pages on the Wisconsin 4-H website at <u>https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/</u> wi4hprojects/ On these pages, you'll find descriptions for statewide projects, internet resources and links of interest, county fair exhibit suggestions, state specialist contacts, and other suggested 4 -H resources.

# How to Select 4-H Projects

- 1) Make a list of things you like to do or want to learn more about. Talk over your list with your parents, leaders, and friends. They may recognize some special things you are good at that you don't even realize you do well.
- 2) Compare your list with the projects described in the Rock County 4-H Project Guide. Ask yourself if you have the equipment, money, and time to do the projects that sound interesting.
- 3) When you're ready to sign up for projects, ask your club organizational leader (club chair) or parent to help you enroll at <u>wi.4honline.com</u> and choose from the drop down menu of projects.
  - Please enroll as soon as you can, so you can participate in projects and activities.
  - Please pay your dues promptly to the 4-H Club you joined.
  - After you submit enrollment and are accepted by the 4-H club chair, log onto 4HOnline once again and double-check that all of the projects you enrolled in are listed. (4-H members will exhibit in each of the projects enrolled in as of March 1, 2020.)

#### Please note:


- ⇒ There is no maximum number of projects you can enroll in. However, a good "rule of thumb" is to enroll in no more than one project for each year you are a 4-H member so you won't become overwhelmed.
- ⇒ Al members are strongly encouraged to exhibit each project publicly (for example at a club meeting, at the Rock County 4-H Fair, or at a public event).
- $\Rightarrow$  Every 4-H member must enroll in at least one project.
- ⇒ Clubs may not set any additional project enrollment requirements.
- ⇒ 4-H members are invited to exhibit entries (in their projects enrolled in as of March 1, 2019) at the Rock County 4-H Fair. To enter, please follow the instructions and guidelines in the Rock County 4-H Fair Premium Book which will be available from your club in March.

*And remember*, you'll learn more than "subject matter" as you complete your projects. You'll learn many life skills that you'll use every day of your life, such as...

understanding yourself • solving problems • communicating better

making decisions • working with others.


