

"It's better to be a blue ribbon kid and have a red ribbon project, than to be a red ribbon kid and have a blue ribbon project."





Contestants may enter up to 3 pies from any of the categories below (no more than one per category)

YOUTH: Open to anyone age 17 and under; Let's encourage those kids out there to learn this special art. For the youth category they can enter up to 2 pies but all will be judged together regardless of type.

The pies will be judged in 5 categories:

- Fruit Pies: apple, blueberry, peach, cherry, lemon etc.
- Specialty Pies: Nut pies, Pumpkin, Custard, candy, sweet potato
- Cream: Coconut, Banana, etc. Prepare for the weather as refrigeration is not guaranteed prior to judging
- Savory: Chicken Pot pie, taco, etc.
- Cheesecake: No this isn't a pie but who doesn't like cheesecake? NEW THIS YEAR!



No store-bought pies, only homemade pies please.

Pie must be entered in the name of the person who made it.





This award recognizes youth who exhibit 4-H spirit and are all around outstanding members. Must be an enrolled in 4-H youth in good standing of an Adams County 4-H Club for at least 2 years. Recommendation can be from a 4-H member, leader or volunteer who is not an immediate family member. Youth has demonstrated outstanding leadership practices in their club and at the county level – please give specific examples.

Friend of 4-H

An annual award given to two non-4-H community member/business that has had a positive impact on 4-H in Adams County. They will have exhibited outstanding service to Adams County 4-H through volunteering or sponsorship. Nominations can be made by any 4-H member, club, or family.

Ivan Morrow Outstanding Award

The Ivan Morrow Outstanding Volunteer Award is an annual award given to two 4-H volunteers. This award is given to recognize volunteers who have given outstanding service to Adams County 4-H at the club or county level. Nominees must be an enrolled 4-H volunteer in good standing of an Adams County 4-H club for at least 2 years. A completed nomination form must be submitted by the deadline of October 15th. A leader may win this award once every 5 years.


