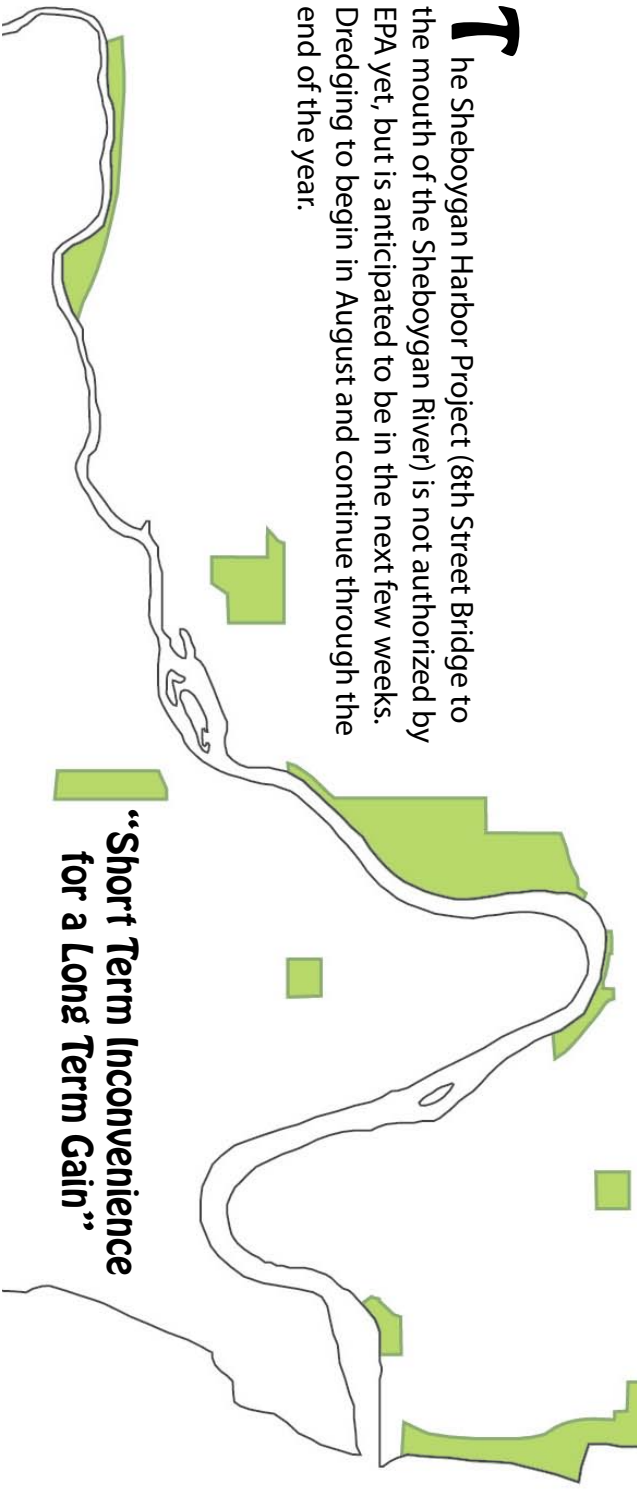

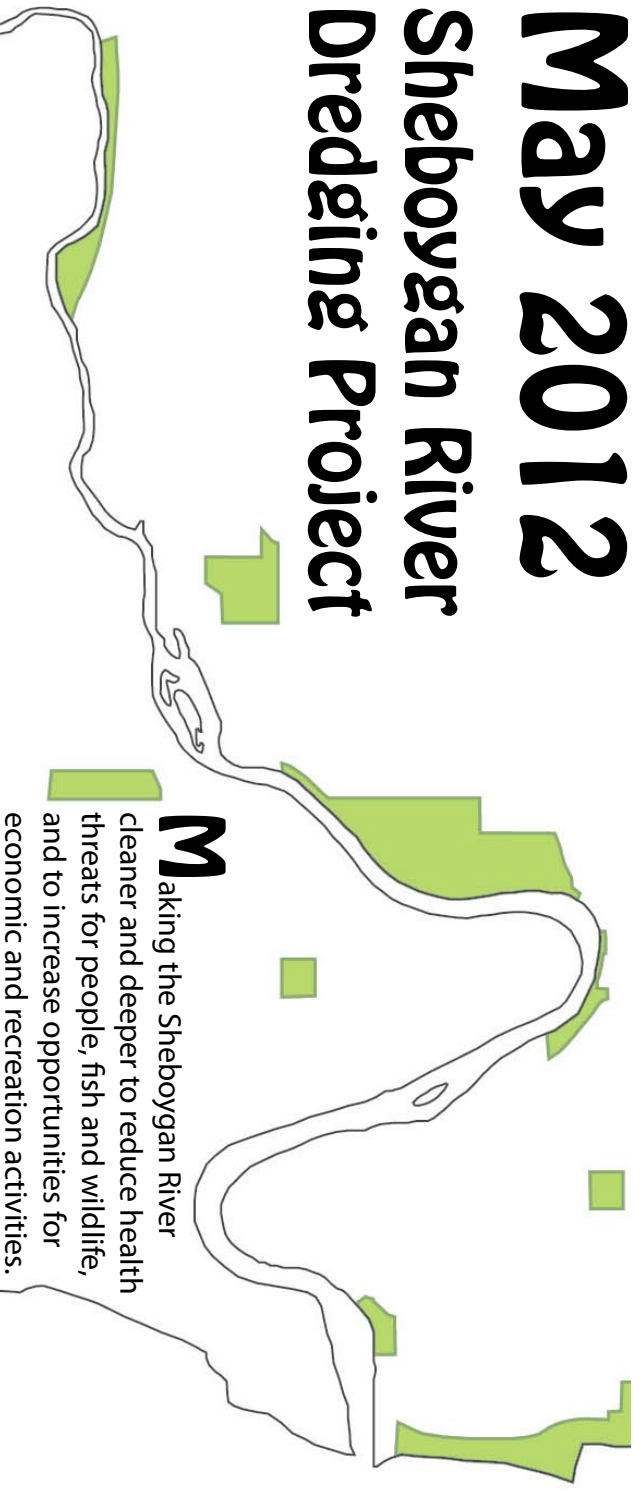

Updates

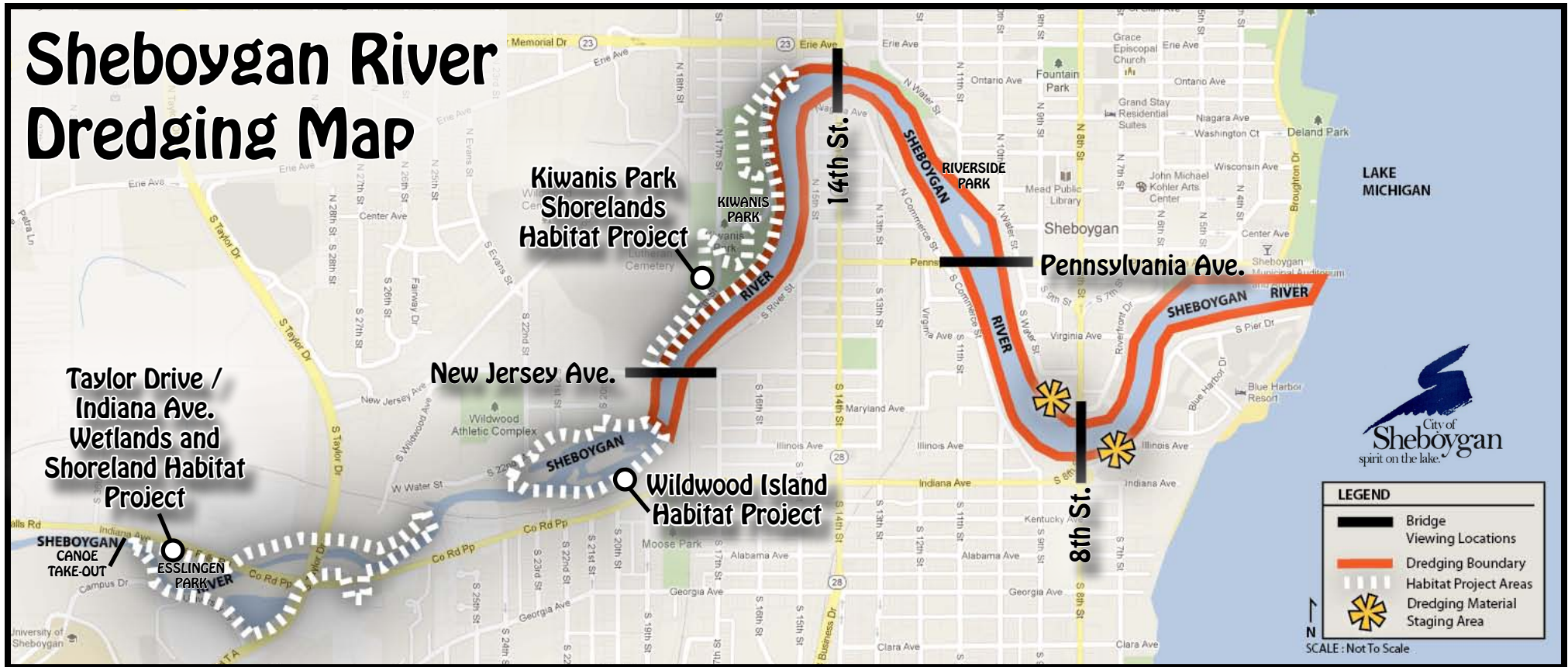
Your Cooperation and Patience is Appreciated!

- The former Alliant Energy property (now owned by WINSA), and the lot immediately east of Habush Habush + Rottier on South Pier are the only two dewatering sites. Riverside Park will no longer be used as a dredging site and will be restored in June.

- The dredging from the 8th Street Bridge to Kiwanis Park will cost \$1.22 million more, which is higher than expected. Additional funding will cover this increase from the Department of Natural Resources.
- The amount of sediment to be dredged will decrease 28,000 cubic yards, from 188,000 to 160,000 cubic yards.
- Dredging is making the river deeper, about 11-15 feet in the harbor and about 5-17 feet upstream of the 8th Street Bridge. This new river depth will allow cruise ships to dock in the City of Sheboygan.

- Dredging is scheduled to begin on July 9th, 2012 from 8th Street to Kiwanis Park. The dredging will occur 24/7 in order to complete the projects by the end of the year.
- Pollution Risk Services (PRS) will start dredging east of 8th Street Bridge on May 7th, 2012. PRS will proceed west to the Pennsylvania Avenue Bridge during the summer.

Notice: Motorized and non-motorized boating is discouraged in 2012 from Esslingen Park to Sheboygan Harbor. For Sheboygan River canoeing and kayaking, consider alternate routes up-river.



Note: Habitat Restoration Projects will occur upstream from the 14th Street Bridge. Projects are set to begin in June 2012.
