ELIGIBILITY – at the time of application, an applicant:

- Must be a current Dane County 4-H member in good standing and an active 4-H member for the last 4 years.
- > Must have received a Bronze 4-H participation pin.
- > All Applications must be typed.
- > Must not have previously received this scholarship.
- Most possess at least a current, cumulative 2.0 grade point average as an enrolled high school senior of a public or private school, including a home-based private educational program, or as a first year post high school student.
- If a graduating high school senior, must submit a current, cumulative high school transcript. A college student must submit a final, cumulative high school transcript and a first semester college transcript.
- Must submit a fully completed Dane County 4-H Scholarship application using only the current year form.
- Must submit the applicant's Permanent Record and Participation Report.
- Must submit a copy of the applicant's Dane County 4-H Cumulative Record of Awards (green form).
- Must deliver the applicant's scholarship application packet in hard copy form to County 4-H personnel inside the Dane County Extension Office by 4:30pm on the first Monday in March (delivery is not satisfied by postmarking or placing packet in outside drop box on due date).

REQUIREMENTS:

At time of submission, applicant's application packet must also include:

- > A completed application cover sheet with all hand-written signatures
- Updated entries to applicant's Permanent Record through March 1 of the current 4-H year and proof within the Permanent Record that it has been consistently maintained since date of applicant's last participation pin.

If either, or both of these requirements are absent, 20 points will be automatically deducted from applicant's total score.

<u>RECOGNITION</u>: Award recipients must submit an 8 x 10 non-returnable photo (professional image not required) to the 4-H Office upon receipt of award notification letter. Award recipients will be introduced at the Dane County Fair Awards Program.

REQUESTING YOUR SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

- Submit proof of completion of one semester of post high school education (submit no earlier than January 1 following the awarding of the scholarship). Submitted proof must reflect that you carried and completed a minimum of six credits and maintained a 2.0 cumulative GPA.
- The scholarship award expires 21 months from the scholarship award notification letter date.
