

2023 Dane County 4-H Financial Award

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ELIGIBILITY – at the time of application, an applicant MUST:

- Be a high school senior or graduate (12th or 13th grade).
- Be a current Dane County 4-H member in good standing and an active 4-H member for the last 4 years.
- Have received a Bronze 4-H participation pin.
- Type the application.
- Not have previously received this scholarship.
- Submit a fully completed Dane County 4-H Scholarship application using only the current year form.
- Submit the applicant's *Permanent Record and Participation Report*.
- Must submit a copy of the applicant's *Dane County 4-H Cumulative Record of Awards* (green form).
- Deliver the applicant's scholarship application packet in hard copy form to County 4-H personnel inside the Dane County Extension Office by 4:30pm on the first Monday in March (delivery is not satisfied by postmarking or placing packet in outside drop box on due date).

REQUIREMENTS:

At time of submission, applicant's application packet must also include:

- A completed application cover sheet *with all hand-written signatures*
- *Updated entries to applicant's Permanent Record through March 1* of the current 4-H year and proof within the Permanent Record that it has been consistently maintained since date of applicant's last participation pin.

If either or both of these requirements are absent, 20 points will be automatically deducted from applicant's total score.

RECOGNITION :

Award recipients must submit a high quality digital (professional image not required) to 4Hinfo@countyofdane.com upon receipt of award notification letter. Award recipients will be introduced at the Dane County Fair Awards Program.
