PLEASE NOTE:

We **CANNOT** prepare Married Filing Separately tax returns at any volunteer site.

Are you claiming the WI Homestead Credit?

To qualify, you must:

- Be at least 18 years old at the end of the tax year
- Have less than \$24,680 in household income
- Rent or own a home or apartment subject to Wisconsin property taxes
- Be a legal resident of Wisconsin all year
- Bring a completed, signed rent certificate and/or copy of your 2019 property tax bill

In addition, you or your spouse must meet one of the following:

- You (or your spouse, if married) have earned income during the year
- You (or your spouse, if married) are disabled, or
- Your (or your spouse, if married) are 62 years of age or older at the end of 2019

What to bring to claim this credit:

- A completed rent certificate and/or copy of your 2019 property tax bill
- Proof of earned income
- Proof of disability (statement from VA, document from SSA, or letter from physician).

Important- Save Time!

What to Bring:

- **Picture ID (Mandatory)**
 - **Copies of actual social security cards for you, all dependents, and spouse if filing jointly (Mandatory)**
 - **ITINs are also accepted**
- Please call for alternative options!**
- Wage statements—Form(s) W-2
 - Pension and Social Security Statements- Form(s) 1099R and SSA-1099
 - Info on all other deductions/credits (include charitable contributions or employee business expenses)
 - A record of any estimated tax payments made for the 2019 tax year
- **All 2019 informational statements, including:**
 - Interest and dividends statements— Form(s) 1099INT and 1099DIV
 - Mortgage interest statements— Form(s) 1098
 - Tuition payments statements— Form(s) 1098T
 - ACA Marketplace statement— Form(s) 1095A
 - Copy of last year's tax return, if available
 - For direct deposit of your refund, a voided check for a Checking account or deposit slip for a savings account

Get the Credit You Deserve!

The **Earned Income Tax Credit or EITC** is a benefit for working people with low to moderate income. To qualify, you must meet certain requirements and file a tax return, even if you do not owe any tax or are not required to file. This credit either reduces the amount of tax you owe or if you don't owe any tax, will give you a refund. Families with qualifying children who claim the Federal EITC are automatically eligible for the Wisconsin EITC.

Qualifying Rules	Maximum Credit You Will Receive Based On # Of Children In Your Household	
	# Of Qualifying Children in Household	Income Cap
You must have worked in 2019 and qualifying children must have lived with you at least 6 months of the year	3+	-Up to \$50,162 (\$55,952 married filing jointly)
	2	-up to \$46,703 (\$52,493 married filing jointly)
	1	-up to \$41,094 (\$46,884 married filing jointly)
	No children (you must be between ages 25-64)	-up \$15,570 (\$21,370 married filing jointly)
