According to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), 91,183 people moved out of Dane County between 2000 and 2005. That compares to the 99,154 people who moved into the county and 358,716 who stayed within the county during the five-year period.

The IRS estimates are based on the addresses listed on individual income tax returns and include the person(s) filing the taxes and all dependents included on the return. Although the IRS only accounts for migration of people who file income tax returns, it does provide a good indicator of where people are moving.

Week Three: Where people move to The IRS data includes a list of the top 250 destinations for people moving out of Dane County. For example, 1,928 former Dane County residents moved to 19 Florida counties included in the top 250 destinations. That compares to 22,730 who moved to other counties within the eight-county Thrive region and 5,690 who moved to
