UW System grads: Where they came from, where they're going

During a break in the Badgers' victory in the Capital One Bowl, a short feature promoting UW-Madison reminded us that the UW System's flagship campus also ranks high in many other categories. UW-Madison ranks number one among universities in the U.S. in both the number of CEOs heading S&P 500 companies and the number of Peace Corps volunteers. While these may seem like strange bedfellows, they only underscore how little most of us really know about UW-Madison and the UW System.

Most people know that UW-Madison is home to about 40,000 students. However, did you know that in 2005-06:

- UWS included 141,624 undergraduate and 21,309 graduate students.
- There were 9,338 Dane County residents who were undergraduates in the UWS, and 19,965 residents of the Capital Region* who were undergraduates in the UWS.
- Wisconsin residents comprised 83 percent of the undergraduates attending UWS.
- The five counties providing the most students to UWS — Milwaukee, Waukesha, Dane, Out-

agamie and Brown — accounted for 38 percent of UWS undergraduates. These five counties also make up 38 percent of the state's population.

- One in 50 Wisconsin residents is currently an undergraduate at a UWS university or college. Also, one in 50 Dane County residents is currently attending UWS as an undergraduate.
- There are more Waukesha County residents (11,258) attending the 26 UWS institutions than Dane County residents (9,338).
- More undergraduates in the Capital Region* attend a UW College (2 year campus) than nine of the 13 UWS four-year campuses
- Thirty-one percent of the state's residents live in a county that does not have a UWS campus.
 However, these counties generated 40 percent of the current undergraduates in the UWS.
