

Hay Market Demand and Price Report for the Upper Midwest For July 14, 2017

All hay prices quoted are dollars per ton FOB point of origin for alfalfa hay unless otherwise noted.

The information presented in this report is compiled from public and private sales and reports in the Midwest.

Hay auction data is collected on the first and third week of the month and posted the following Monday when possible. Prices quoted in this report are for "as fed" alfalfa hay.

Demand and Sales Comments

The hay market was steady this week and showing some strength. Lower quality hay at the market is discounted. There is drought talk in the western markets and hay donation sites are available if you would like to donate hay (see state comments).

For Nebraska, hay sold steady this past week with an increase of inquiries. Some areas of the state are drier than normal and pastures are short. Second cutting is wrapping up and some have begun third cutting. For Iowa, prices were steady to firm this week. Weather has been good this past week to allow hay harvest.

In South Dakota, alfalfa prices were mostly steady with light to moderate demand. Over 93% of South Dakota is in some stage of drought and cattlemen are making decisions as pasture may not recover to feed their cattle. For Missouri, triple digit temperatures are allowing hay to dry and soils. Scattered showers have provided some relief. Hay movement is light, demand is light, supplies are moderate and prices are steady.

In Southwest Minnesota, adequate supply of hay, price trend is steady with limited quality hay available.

In Wisconsin, no drought talk in WI. Weather has not cooperated as wet weather is the concern. Second crop has come off the fields and some old first crop hay is being made for bedding as it has little value to feed livestock.

Hay export report for July 14, 2017, 3,750 tons were exported this past week, price ranged from \$140.00 - \$160.00 per ton from USDA.

Straw prices were steady to stronger this week with limited reports. Small square bale straw price averaged \$2.80 a bale this week (range of \$1.50 to \$5.00). Large square bale straw was \$37.00 per bale (range of \$20.00 to \$45.00). Large round bales averaged \$37.00 a bale this week. There was a wide range of prices this week (range of \$18.00-\$59.00).
