Winners will be notified as well as being honored at the Leaders Association Banquet and high school graduation if applicable. Winners must submit their Fall transcripts to the Teen Association adviser (official or unofficial). After the transcripts are received, scholarship funds will be distributed to the winner at the beginning of their Spring semester in higher education.
