FEMA BRIC program: Opportunities for Lake Superior coastal communities

Overview: Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) is a new, pre-disaster FEMA program designed to fund innovative hazard mitigation projects that emphasize partnerships and multiple community benefits. BRIC emphasizes supporting Tribal, state, and local hazard mitigation projects "through capability- and capacity-building; encouraging and enabling innovation; promoting partnerships; enabling large projects; maintaining flexibility; and providing consistency" (FEMA 2020).

This virtual event will feature three regional experts who will discuss how the BRIC program can support coastal resiliency and hazard mitigation in the Lake Superior basin. Lake Superior Reserve

The Lake Superior National Estuarine Research Reserve (<https://lakesuperiorreserve.org/>) is part of a network of 29 National Estuarine Research Reserves across the United States, and one of only two Reserves in the Great Lakes.

The Reserve System was created to support coastal resources and the human communities they support. Located in the St. Louis River estuary between Superior, Wisconsin, and Duluth, Minnesota, the Lake Superior Reserve serves as a hub for research, education, monitoring, and training for coastal researchers, decision-makers, and community members.

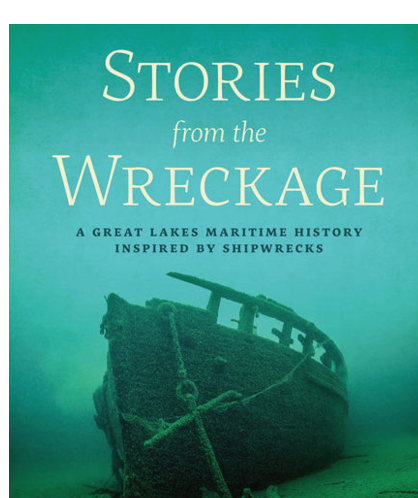

WHS launches Northern Wisconsin Book Club with *Stories from the Wreckage*

The Wisconsin Historical Society (WHS) invites Northern Wisconsin book lovers and amateur historians to join a new book club. Designed to connect Northern Wisconsin residents to each other through lively and engaging dialogue, this fall club members will read and discuss books featuring Northern Wisconsin people and places.

The first selection is *Stories from the Wreckage: A Great Lakes Maritime History Inspired by Shipwrecks* by John Odin Jensen. Using wreckage evidence and historical sources, Jensen explores how these doomed vessels, from ship design to ultimate disaster, contribute to our understanding of Midwestern and Atlantic maritime histories. These dramatic tales of calamity become even more compelling when connected to the key people, resources, demands, and current events of the day. The book is filled with captivating underwater photos of wreckages, ship design plans, route maps, and other historical visuals.

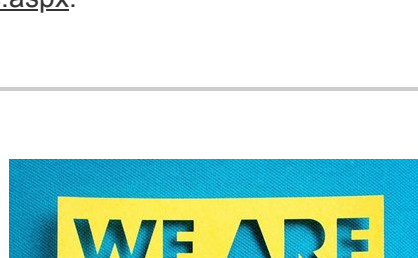
2021-2022 Coastal Management Grants

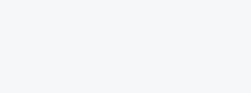

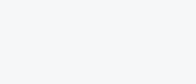
