- *Travel Dates*: June 21-26, 2019

 - Group Meeting(Chaperones & trip delegates: 7p.m.
 - Depart Merrill at 10p.m.
 - o Arrive to Merrill June 26 around 1p.m.
- **Application Process(Now-March13):** Please fill out the short application for found at: http://bit.ly/4HDCRegistration2020. A committee will review applications and notify trip delegates of selection by March 25th.
- Mandatory Meeting: May 11, 2020 6:30p.m. at the Lincoln County Service Center (801 N Sales St, Merrill, WI) All delegates <u>must attend</u> the mandatory meeting <u>with a parent or guardian</u>. We will discuss trip specifics, delegate code of conduct, dress code, delegate responsibilities, and more. It is necessary that all youth attend this meeting.
- Delegate Meeting: June 21, 2020 7p.m.at the Lincoln County Service Center (801 N Sales St, Merrill, WI) Thie before we depart is for the delegates and chaperones to get to know one another; review behavior expectations; learn more about the places we will visit; and our responsibilities such as caring for our bus, our roommates, and more.
- **Chaperones:** We have started a list of adult volunteers interested in joining us on this trip as a chaperone. Chaperones <u>must be a current approved</u> 4-H Volunteer Leader.

 - A mandatory chaperone meeting will take place on Wed, May 6th at 6pm. Place to be determined.
 - Chaperone Roles May Include: support youth on this trip; observe and verity the
 whereabouts of each youth; participate in assigned activities and assist the directors as
 needed. Plan on walking 5 or more miles each day, sleeping on the bus, and other
 strenuous work as needed. Information on chaperone roles will be available once selection
 has been made.
- Group Medic: We will need at least one chaperone to be a group medic to disperse
 meds/assist with injuries or illness/check on overall health of youth. If you have CPR/First Aid
 certification & experience in this area or have a medical background.
- Available Youth Spots: 20 for Lincoln County and 20 for Langlade County; As 20 spots fill, we
 will start a waiting list. Open spots on either side will be filled form waiting lists.
- **Spending Money**: All parts of the trip are funded except for spending money. Trip souvenirs can be pricey, plus there is not a lot of room to bring many items home. It is recommended that youth bring no more than \$50-75 for souvenirs and/or snacks.
- **Tshirts**: Families will purchase t-shirts for the youth. The shirts will be great souvenirs for the youth, but also provide a level of group management and identity in a very, very busy city. More details to follow.
- **Snacks/Water:** Families will have an opportunity to assist with providing snacks for the trip. More information will be provided at the mandatory meeting.
- **Night Security:** Tour group provides night time hotel security for our group. Making sure the youth stay in rooms, no one bothers our rooms, etc.
