Answer garden questions

Jefferson County Master Gardener Volunteers answered 54 garden-related inquiries this year via their helpline. Clients could meet face to face with a MGV to help with any gardening dilemma. Or, questions could be sent by email or phone. There were 11 MGVs working over 146 hours on this project.



Educate community with garden at Historical Museum

MGVs plan and maintain gardens of the Hoard Historical Museum, a local nonprofit museum in Fort Atkinson, WI. TripAdvisor ranks the museum as #2 of things to do in Fort Atkinson. In addition, MGVs provide educational programs averaging 25 participants at each session.



Teach kids how to garden

Since 2011, MGVs have engaged students at Jefferson West Elementary School in garden programming aimed at improving food literacy. During the 2017–18 school year, MGVs taught approximately 22 students in each of the 14 sessions to plant, maintain, and harvest vegetables from the garden. MGVs participate in school family nights to share garden produce and recipes with families attending the event. In the spring of 2018, MGVs had over 250 students come to the garden and taught them how to plant seeds and seedlings all within a two day time span. This year via a grant, the garden obtained a new storage shed for tools and materials.
