Dual-Notice Pesticides Registered for use in Wisconsin

- DO NOT USE THIS TABLE AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR READING THE PESTICIDE LABEL. The information in this table man not be complete and is intended for reference only.
- For some active ingredients listed here, there may be formulation which are not dual-notice pesticides.
- Don't automatically assume that a dual-notice pesticide is also classified as a restricted-use pesticide, or visa versa.

A dual-notice pesticide is a pesticide whose label, in the Agricultural Use box, requires the agricultural employer (i.e. farmer) to notify non-family agricultural workers both orally **<u>and</u>** by posting that a site has been treated with the pesticide. For example, "Notify workers of the application by warning them orally and by posting warning signs at entrances to treated areas." Wis. Adm. Code Chapter ATCP (Pesticide Use and Control) further requires that the applicator post any treated with a dual-notice pesticide if that site borders within 300 feet of a nonagricultural area where persons are likely to be present (e.g. residence, schools) during the application and/or the restricted-entry interval specified on the pesticide label.

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR Part 170. This standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), notification to workers, and restricted-entry intervals. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted-entry interval (REI) of 48 hours.

PPE required for early entry to treated areas that is permitted under the Worker Protection Standard and that involves contact with anything that has been treated such as plants, soil, or water, is:

- · Coveralls worn over short-sleeved shirt and short pants,
- · Chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material,
- · Chemical-resistant footwear plus socks,
- · Protective eyewear, and
- · Chemical-resistant headgear (if overhead exposure).

Notify workers of the application by warning them orally and by posting warning signs at entrances to treated areas.

These two statements, although different, specify that these products are "Dual-Notice" Pesticides.

You have to notify non-family employees orally AND post signs.

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40CFR part 170. This standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted-entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard. Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted entry interval (REE) of 24 hours.

Double Notification: Notify workers of the application by warning them orally and by posting warning signs at entrances to treated areas.

- Eye Protection: For at least seven days following the application of BEAN GUARD/ALLEGIANCE:
- At least one container designed specifically for flushing eyes must be available in operating condition at the Worker Protection Standard-required
- decontamination site for workers entering the area treated with BEAN GUARD/ALLEGIANCE, and 2. workers must be informed orally, in a manner they can
 - understand: that residues in the treated area may be highly irritating
- to their eyes, - that they should take precautions, such as refraining from rubbing their eyes to keep the residue out of their
- eyes, that if they do get residue in their eyes, they should immediately flush their eyes, with the eyeflush container
- immediately flush their eyes, with the eyeflush container that is located at the decontamination site, and - how to operate the eyeflush container. Exception: Once the seeds are planted in soil or other planting

Exception: Once the seeds are planted in soil or other planting media, the Worker Protection Standard allows workers to enter the treated area without restriction if there will be no contact with the soil/media subsurface.

PPE required for early entry to treated areas that is permitted under the Worker Protection Standard and that involves contact with anything that has been treated, or treated seed is: coveralls, chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material, shoes plus socks, and goggles or faceshield.
