Enrollment Tips

Soon you'll be signing up for new projects for the upcoming year. Consider the following:

- ALL enrollments for current 4-H and FFA members are due on JANUARY 5 in order to show at the 2020 Shawano County Fair! See <u>https://</u> wi.4honline.com to enroll.
- While you can enroll in up to 5 projects (plus Youth Leadership), be realistic in your time commitments. Animal related projects can take a LOT of time to be done well.
- Did you know that ANY youth member can take entries to the fair in Recycling and you don't have to be enrolled in that project to do so? This may be helpful for those of you who find it hard to limit yourself to 5 projects. The same is true for all Safety and Citizenship entries found in Dept. 134, Health, Social and Political Science.
- There are unlimited possibilities for you to explore in Youth Leadership. Opportunities include taking charge of a community service project, assisting with your club or project leader, serving on County Key committees, being a camp counselor, and much more.

- If you are a youth leader, you can indicate in the online enrollment process which projects you would like to help with. Please do so. This will help the club leaders know who they can ask for assistance! Never been a youth leader before? There is no age requirement. Consider being a youth leader if you are knowledgeable in your project area and want to help other kids learn more.
- Do you have an interest that just doesn't seem to fall into any other category? Self-Determined is just what you're looking for! You have the freedom to create your own project by identifying resources, outlining a plan, then completing and evaluating it.

AGAIN THIS YEAR: You can enroll online in the 4hOnline program and digitally complete necessary forms with your enrollment. Go to: <u>http://wi.4honline.com</u> to complete your enrollment. (*There are reminder instructions for both those re-enrolling as well are those enrolling for the first time.*) This will ensure you will continue to receive the Clover Line, get accurate recognition for years of service, and complete the first step to receiving a fair pass. If you forgot your password, there is a button to request that we reset it for you.

<u>NEW:</u> In 4-H there are many ways to volunteer. This year, you will need to select in which ways you will be volunteering your time: Activity/Event Volunteer, Adult Advisor/Chaperone, Club Enrollment Coordinator, Club Leader, Committee Volunteer, or Project Leader. Provide opportunities for young people to develop life skills in new and diverse settings across the state and nation.

Encourage youth leaders to learn about and appreciate different ideas and perspectives while forming lasting relationships.

Prepare young people for future opportunities and experiences that require independence, decision making, and problem solving.

Inspire action in youth and adult volunteers in their clubs, their communities, and their schools.

Traveling is a great way to learn through doing. It has been proven that youth increase skills around effective communication, problem solving, citizenship (global appreciation and history), financial independence, and teamwork. Shawano County and Wisconsin 4-H provide such opportunities at affordable prices.

There are educational opportunities available for every youth, beginning in 6th grade and spanning through the year after high school. The locations of these trips is to Madison, Washington D.C., Atlanta, GA, and beyond. If you are interested in an international destination, please contact Megan directly.

Anyone is able to sign up for the trips listed in through 4-H Online (except for the 4-H American Road Trip.) In order to be eligible to receive significant financial support* (65-75% of listed price), kids should fill out a resume and

portfolio, and return it to the UW-Extension Office by Friday, November 15th. You may drop it off or e-mail it to <u>msuehring@wisc.edu.</u>

Youth will be asked to attend a short interview on the evening of Monday, November 25th (same night as the Leaders Meeting.) Those with conflicts can reschedule. There are multiple spots available on trips.

If selected, your child will be given the option of accepting funding through the Shawano 4-H Leader's Association. There are several stipulations with accepting moneys, such as being available to speak to different groups if asked, working several food stand shifts, helping contribute to an educational booth at the Shawano County Fair, and speaking at the annual 4-H Experience. Members may choose to not accept the assistance and will pay the full price.

PROGRAM COSTS

Registration fees include transportation from central locations, lodging, most meals, and orientation and program support materials.

Qualified and trained Wisconsin 4-H Adult Advisors accompany youth groups.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation sponsors a portion of the fees to decrease costs for county 4-H participants. Many county 4-H leader boards also provide local financial support. Visit your county 4-H Office to inquire. The remaining amount is the responsibility of the delegate and his/her family.

Estimated cost up to \$1000 (member pays 35% or approximately \$350). Additional costs above \$1000 are at members' expense, as those traveling will determine the itinerary.

Financial Guidelines

'Tis the Season that 4-H is known for being especially GENEROUS...

Please consider these thoughts as we approach the giving season. We've begun to have rich discussions around investing in service learning and education, especially on the club level. As you're planning activities for December, please utilize the following guidelines to the best of your ability:

Excerpts from: Fundraising for an Outside Group or Organization Policy

The Wisconsin 4-H Program holds that the occasional participation of 4-H members in fundraising activities in support of outside groups and organizations as part of a service learning activity provides a high-quality youth development experience. It is important to note that a group is defined as a "class" of individuals that have a common need and not an individual person or family.

- 4-H clubs or groups may collect non-cash items or cash contributions that are then used to buy supplies and materials to carry out their service learning activity. They may not donate cash to any group or organization outside of 4-H.
- The local 4-H staff member must approve the proposed fundraising activity as appropriate from a programmatic, youth-development perspective.
- The fundraising effort must not promote or benefit a specific religion, political party or political candidate. 4-H Clubs or groups can participate in a fundraising efforts with an organization that is religious or political in nature if the effort benefits the entire community. An example would be a 4-H club could donate food to a food pantry that is run by a local church, but is open to the entire community.
- The group or organization must not discriminate in their membership on the basis of race, color, sex, handicap, religion, age, sexual orientation or national origin.
- The local 4-H staff must approve the group or organization as an appropriate recipient of fundraising efforts.
- Fundraising activities must be clearly identified as benefiting the recipient group or organization so donors understand who is receiving the goods or services.
- Fundraising efforts must comply with all 4-H Youth Development Policies.
- All fundraising activities must be approved by the membership either through an adopted budget or action (i.e., vote) by the 4-H club or group.
- When a 4-H group engages in a fundraising activity to benefit another group (e.g., fire victims) or organization (e.g., Red Cross) a sign must be posted to make clear to potential donors that the funds will be used to benefit the other group (e.g., fire victims) or organization (e.g., Red Cross).
 - Checks should be made payable to the 4-H club or group.
 - Cash received during the fundraising activity must be counted by two persons.
 - All money received must be processed according to Wisconsin 4-H Policy.
 - Checks and cash must be deposited into a 4-H account prior to the purchase of supplies and materials needed to carry out the service learning activity.
 - All expenditures must be made by check from the 4-H club or group treasury, and properly recorded on the 4-H club or group account ledgers including the purpose.
- If a 4-H group is fundraising to benefit a nonprofit or tax-exempt organization, the 4-H club or group should work
 with the charitable organization ahead of time to obtain tax receipts that can be given to donors upon collection of
 their contribution. Donations are only tax-deductible if made to a qualified organization (i.e., a non-profit or
 tax-exempt organization).

This is a BIG change for some. Please consider alternatives that encourage our kids to "do". Instead of donating money to toys for tots, a 4-H group could agree to spend a certain amount of money on toys, then let several members purchase them and put them in an appropriate donation receptacle. Instead of donating direct money to a food pantry, consider letting several kids purchase groceries that they enjoy eating to donate. There are many ways in which we can learn through doing!
