Enrollment for 2021

Enrollment Time

ALL enrollments for current 4-H and FFA members are due on JANUARY 5 in order to show at the 2021 Shawano County Junior Fair Division!

- You should have received word by now that there was a big upgrade to the enrollment system. 4-H Online 2.0 is now open for enrollments! Go to <http://wi.4honline.com> to access the new system. Your family login will be the same as you used last year. If your password does not work, click on the Reset Password link on the login page and you will be emailed a new one.
- The system will look totally different from what we had in the past, but you can use the family enrollment guide at: https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/4h-ext/files/2020/09/4HOnline.v2.Family.Enrollment.Guide_.pdf for help during the enrollment process.
- Not sure which project to try? You can find more information in the Shawano County 4-H 2021 Project Guide that you should receive from your club leader or you can find it at: <https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/shawano4h/enrollment-time/>
- The new system is more streamlined and easier to use, as well as mobile friendly so you can use your phone to enroll! There will be more features coming, like Spanish language translation and additional club leader features.

Enrollment Tips

Soon you'll be signing up for new projects for the upcoming year. Consider the following:

- While there is no longer a limit in how many projects you can enroll in, be realistic in your time commitments. Animal related projects, especially, can take a LOT of time to be done well.
- There are **unlimited possibilities** for you to explore in **Youth Leadership**. Maybe you want to take charge of community service project, assist your club or project leader, serve on a county planning committees, be a camp counselor. Check it out!
- If you are a youth leader, you can indicate in the online enrollment process which projects you would like to help with. Please do so. This will help the club leaders know who they can ask for assistance! Never been a youth leader before? There is no age requirement. Consider being a youth leader if you are knowledgeable in your project area and want to help other kids learn more.
- Do you have an interest that just doesn't seem to fall into any other category? Self-Determined is just what you're looking for! Here you can create your own project by identifying resources, outlining a plan, then completing and evaluating it. You will see you can choose this option in each program area, from animal science to family living.



Attention: All Adult 4-H Volunteer Leaders

You can enroll online in the 4hOnline program and digitally complete necessary forms with your enrollment. Go to: <http://wi.4honline.com> to complete your enrollment. This will ensure you will continue to receive the Clover Line, get accurate recognition for years of service, and complete the first step to receiving a fair pass. ALL first year adults wishing to serve as volunteers (club general leaders, project and activity leaders, coaches, etc.) are required to attend a two-hour orientation/training and will undergo a background check by the state 4-H office prior to being activated as a 4-H leader. Attendance at this training will meet this requirement!

Money Matters

'Tis the Season that 4-H is known for being especially GENEROUS...

Please consider these thoughts as we approach the giving season. We continue to have rich discussions around investing in service learning and education, especially on the club level. As you're planning activities for December, please utilize the following guidelines to the best of your ability:

Excerpts from: **Fundraising for an Outside Group or Organization Policy**

The Wisconsin 4-H Program holds that the occasional participation of 4-H members in fundraising activities in support of outside groups and organizations as part of a service learning activity provides a high-quality youth development experience. It is important to note that a group is defined as a "class" of individuals that have a common need and not an individual person or family.

- **4-H clubs or groups may collect non-cash items or cash contributions that are then used to buy supplies and materials to carry out their service learning activity. They may not donate cash to any group or organization outside of 4-H.**
- The local 4-H staff member must approve the proposed fundraising activity as appropriate from a programmatic, youth-development perspective.
- The fundraising effort must not promote or benefit a specific religion, political party or political candidate. 4-H Clubs or groups can participate in a fundraising efforts with an organization that is religious or political in nature if the effort benefits the entire community. An example would be a 4-H club could donate food to a food pantry that is run by a local church, but is open to the entire community. *(Local examples: 4-H Clubs may not ring bells for Salvation Army as a "club". However, clubs may donate time or goods to SAM 25, the homeless shelter in Shawano. If someone wishes to put together a "shift" of interested people to ring bells, they may extend the invitation. However, the club itself may not organize the activity and it will not be covered under insurance.)*
- The local 4-H staff must approve the group or organization as an appropriate recipient of fundraising efforts.
- Fundraising efforts must comply with all 4-H Youth Development Policies. For the foreseeable future, fundraising events are unable to be held "in person".
- All fundraising activities must be approved by the membership either through an adopted budget or action (i.e., vote) by the 4-H club or group.

Change can be difficult. However, please consider alternatives that encourage our kids to "do". Instead of donating money to toys for tots, a 4-H group could agree to spend a certain amount of money on toys, then let several members purchase them and put them in an appropriate donation receptacle. Instead of donating direct money to a food pantry, consider letting several kids purchase groceries that they enjoy eating to donate. There are many ways in which we can learn through doing!

Best Practices

- The treasurer position in a 4-H Club is a youth position. This is a **valuable** youth leadership role.
- Checks should require 2 signatures: the club treasurer and an adult volunteer leader. The two signatories should not be related to each other. Avoid having a parent-child as both signatories.
- Use good money handling practices:
 - Write a receipt for all monies received. The receipt should include the amount, source of the funds (such as a car wash or plat book sale), the date, and the name of the person making the payment. Receipts are back-up records for bank deposits made. Receipts should become a permanent part of the club files.
 - Deposit all monies into the bank account promptly.
 - Pay all bills promptly.
- Members need to approve payments. This is done through the approved budget. If the payment is outside the approved budget, a vote is needed by the membership at the next meeting.
- A payment approval form should be used and the receipt from the purchase should be attached.
- Financial records should be kept up-to-date and reported at each 4-H Club or Group meeting.

Discuss Money with Your 4-H Club or Group

Members should vote on dues annually. Members should decide if fund raising is needed to have funds for their planned activities. Members should approve a budget.
