Contracts and eartags will be available at two times: April 10, IF you are registering for Super Saturday livestock events. Sheep and Goat Exhibitors

When purchasing animals that you wish to exhibit at the fair, documentation is required from the seller that states their animal was born in the United States. (Country Of Origin Labeling - COOL). This can be a bill of sale, an affidavit, etc, which needs to remain in your possession as exhibitor of this animal. The day you purchase your project animal, would be a very convenient time to get this taken care of. The COOL Affidavit form is available at Livestock credit meetings the 4-H website and on https:// fyi.extension.wisc.edu/shawano4h/files/2017/12/ Country-of-Origin-Affidavit-COOL-Fillable.pdf Make one copy for yourself (keep it for two years) and submit one copy to the UW-Madison Division of Extension office.

The Scholarship Committee has revised the Shawano County Livestock Committee Scholarship form. The Scholarship Committee will be recommending the Livestock Committee approves the changes to the form. Once approved, the form will be available on our website by mid-April. **The scholarship deadline is May 31, 2021**. Sheep, beef, and swine exhibitors in grades 11-13 should apply for the scholarship. A maximum of five scholarships are awarded; past recipients have received amounts between \$500-\$5000.

Important livestock note in 2021:

- The Livestock County Planning Committee is requiring **THREE EDUCATIONAL MEETING CREDITS** to be earned to sell in the livestock auction. Read your mailing for more details.
 - ♦ One of those credits must be YQCA just like last year. This credit will not carry over from 2020.

June Dairy Month Display Contest sponsored by Shawano County Dairy Promotions, Inc.

4-H, FFA, individual families or nonprofit youth group will have the option to have a lawn display and/or a video clip of 2-5 minutes. The lawn display and/or video message should reflect a positive educational message and promotion of the dairy industry.

Video Clip:

To qualify for a \$20 reimbursement for participation in the video clip contest, each 4-H/FFA or nonprofit youth group must provide the below no later than June 1st to Heidi Pettis, Media Coordinator at Heidi.a.zahn@gmail.com



Video clip of 2-5 minutes in length uploaded to YouTube.

- 1. Email YouTube video link to Shawano County Dairy Promotion Inc. Media coordinator- Heidi Pettis
- 2. A copy of the completed Model Release form (scan, mail or electronic photo). https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/ shawano4h/current-registrations/

Lawn display:

- 1. Promotional displays must be in place by June 1st and remain in place until June 30th.
- 2. Display must be highly visible from a public road and located in Shawano County. (Please be careful to not place the lawn display in "legal" road right of way).
- 3. Permission must be obtained from the titled landowner/business to place the display on their property.

To qualify for a \$20 reimbursement for participation in the lawn display contest, each 4-H, FFA, individual families or nonprofit youth group must provide the following by June 1st to Mary Lou Kugel, kugmlou5@gmail.com:

- 1. One to four digital photos of the display. If you opt to mail in hard copy, please send to Mary Lou Kugel W5924 Porter Rd, Shawano, WI 54166
- 2. A copy of the thank you that was sent to the titled landowner/business, if using a family lawn this requirement is exempt.
- 3. A copy of the completed Model Release form. If there are no youth in the photo(s) being submitted, only a General Leader or Co-Leader need to complete the model release and provide a signature. (scan, mail or electronic photo page 1, page 2 if applicable) https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/shawano4h/current-registrations/

Judging in each category will be based on a combination of "likes" and "shares" on the Shawano County DAIRY Promotion Facebook page from the time of posting by the event coordinators until midnight on June 30th along with the results from a panel of judges. 1st thru 3rd place cash prizes (\$50, \$40, \$30) in each category of lawn display and video clip will be named at the Annual 4-H Experience. Any group not meeting all of the criteria listed for each category will forfeit the right to receive the \$20 participation funds and consideration of award placings.


Three Parts of a 4-H Meeting

When planning 4-H club or group meetings, it's important to include the three parts of a meeting. Those three parts are most commonly known as Business, Education and Recreation. Sometimes it's challenging to think about meetings using those terms - so we'd like to introduce you to a different perspective - Leading (Business), Learning (Education) and Laughing (Recreation)!

Leading (Business, 15-20 minutes): This is the official club decision making part of the meeting, when you, as a club, decide what you're going to do as a club. This part of the meeting is led by the youth leaders (sometimes officers, but this is where YOUTH VOICE is important!)

15-20 Minutes 15-20 Minutes

THREE PARTS OF A MEETING



Learning (Education, 20-30 minutes): 4-H is all about

education. During this part of the meeting, you, as a club, learn something. This could be a guest speaker, a member demonstration, community service, or a project. Don't forget to use your youth members as teachers!

Laughing (Recreation, 15-20 minutes): If we are not having fun in 4-H, we are missing a huge opportunity! A name game, team builder, service project or activity is a great way to build relationships, get to know members and families, and make club memories. And don't forget the snack time - food brings people together! You may even have a youth member who is willing to lead these activities!

The Experiential Learning Model

The Experiential Learning Model is one of the most important building blocks of 4-H and positive youth development. The best way to engage youth in learning is to create experiential learning opportunities, allowing youth to explore

DO - REFLECT - APPLY EXPERIENCE Participants engage in learning activity SHARE APPLY **Participants** Relate new review what skills to DO occurred during everyday life the activity REFLECT **PROCESS** GENERALIZE Make connections Review how between activity the activity was performed and life skills

and discover rather than listen to lectures or read information. In fact, the science behind how we learn supports this theory. We are more likely to remember things that we do or teach other people rather than information that we read or hear.

The model is five simple steps that guide youth through a process of hands-on activities, critical thinking, and learning.

- 1. Experience: Participants engage in learning activity
- 2. **Share**: Participants review what occurred during the activity
- 3. Process: Review how the activity was performed
- 4. Generalize: Make connections between activity and life skills
- 5. Apply: Relate new skills to everyday life
