ADULT & YOUTH LEADERS

LEADERSHIP: more than being present

We have a wonderful cohort of new adult leaders coming on board. During our Volunteers In Preparation Training, I remind leaders how many different ways there are to contribute to Wisconsin 4-H.

As seasoned leaders, general leaders, and youth, I am expecting that we will be sharing opportunities to <u>lead</u> with our new leaders.

Being a leader means more than "just showing up" to the meetings. Being a leader means that you have spent intentional time thinking about what life skills youth will be learning. Project meetings should be advertised at the 4-H community club meeting prior to the project meeting. Here is your reminder that it is okay for programs to **CHANGE.**

One of the "perks" of being a leader in Shawano County 4-H is the opportunity to earn a county fair pass. To do so, you must be involved with the youth of your club, (more than your own kids), for a minimum of 6 hours per year in a **leadership** capacity.

Ideas of things a LEADER may take charge on: working with a committee of youth to plan or organize an event, teaching a project meeting, taking leadership on a club learning event, such as an educational experience (i.e. club field trip.) There are opportunities to demonstrate leadership on the county and state level as well. Contact Megan for more information.

Annual Leader Training

Community clubs must fulfill their obligation of having one youth and one adult participate. Join Wisconsin 4-H in a yearlong experience - Learn Together, Lead Together: Youth-Adult Partnerships! We will kick off with two sessions for the 2021-2022 Annual Leader Training. Plan for interaction and engagement, and all youth and adult leaders are invited to participate!

Leave with ideas to use right now in growing youth adult-partnerships in your club and community. We hope all youth and adult leaders join us.

Any members with your own archery equipment will need to have your bow and arrows checked over/approved by an archery shop to make sure they are in safe and correct operating condition. To help with this, we will be having two work nights in December at Butch's Archery when you can get this done. Equipment must be checked/approved before you will able to practice, Butch's Archery *WILL NOT* be doing this on any days of practice, so be sure to find time for this before coming. If you have a breakdown of equipment or need something at practice, they will gladly help you out. If you have an email that is different from the one you used to sign up for 4H please let us know. We will be sending out reminders, information and updates throughout the year and don't want to miss anyone. The first time you come to practice you will need to bring the Expectations form, Emergency Contact form, and if you have your own bow you will need the Archery Inspection form. ANIMAL SCIENCE

Sheep and Goat Exhibitors

When purchasing animals that you wish to exhibit at the fair, <u>documentation is required from the seller</u> <u>that states their animal was born in the United</u> <u>States</u>. (Country Of Origin Labeling – COOL) This can be a bill of sale, an affidavit, etc, which needs to remain in your possession as exhibitor of this animal. The day you purchase your project animal would be a very convenient time to get this taken care of. The COOL Affidavit form is available at Livestock credit meetings and on the 4-H website. Make one copy for yourself (keep it for two years) and submit one copy to the Extension office.

Poultry & Rabbit Members

There will be separate rabbit and poultry clinics offered at Super Saturday - which will include a market credit. Plan to attend both clinics if you are in both the rabbit and poultry projects. You <u>must</u> attend at least one clinic to show at the Shawano County fair next year. If you plan on entering market animals, you <u>must</u> also have one market meeting credit to exhibit in the small animal auction. There will be a limited number of clinics offered before next year's fair. Please plan ahead and get your credits early! You are asked to attend at least one work day as well to show at the Shawano County fair. You can either attend the set up day or take down day.

WI 4-H Foundation Scholarships

Due: March 15

Students must have been a 4-H member, have a GPA of at least 2.5 and be enrolled at a college, university or tech school. Grades 10 - 12: Go Places With Wisconsin 4-H!

We are excited to announce that two statewide opportunities are opening up applications/registration starting today! Both the 2022 National 4-H Conference and the 2022 Citizenship Washington Focus programs will be in-person in 2022. Both of these programs are open to youth in 10-12th grades. The application process for National 4-H Conference will open today and applications will be due by January 2nd.

National 4-H Conference

National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults—at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture—assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs and other federal department activities nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Provinces. The Conference includes roundtable discussions and federal partner agency presentations and an opportunity for delegates to engage with their U.S. Senators and Representatives. At the same time, we want to ensure that the conference is a rich and meaningful experience for the youth and adult participants.

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF)

Citizenship Washington Focus, or CWF for short, is the premier week long 4-H citizenship and leadership experience. CWF brings 4-H delegations from all over the country to stay in Washington D.C., our Nation's Capital! Participants learn about the roles of Senators and Representatives in the United States' government and how these parts work together to form an effective Congress. Additionally, youth get to see and experience government in action by meeting with their State's members of Congress and watching a House of Representatives meeting. Delegates also participate in various educational workshops such as:

- Citizenship Toolbox: By exploring what it means to be a good citizen, delegates identify their own skill set to become active citizens and leaders in their communities back home.
- Congressional Issues: Delegates will have open discussions with different perspectives on real national issues in the government today.

Approximate cost:

\$1750*

- Bill Writing: Delegates learn the process of writing a bill in the House of Representatives and then write one of their own. They then will hold a mock House of Representatives meeting where they will discuss and either pass or deny said bills.
- Action Planning: By combining all of the skills they have learned at CWF, the entire delegation will discuss what issues are prominent in their communities. They will then develop a plan to take back and implement positive change into their hometowns.

January 15, Shawano High School Registration: 8:00, Sessions begin at 8:30am (morning only) \$5.00 early bird registration before December 20 (for youth and adults) Get it in before the busy Christmas vacation and see quite a savings! (\$8.00 per person before January 7, \$10 if registering that day)

Do you have friends or relatives who might be interested in 4-H but don't understand what it's all about? Invite them to Super Saturday and they'll get a great introduction to the many opportunities available through 4-H. Actually, even without the intention of joining 4-H, ALL youth are welcome to participate in this fun and educational day. As the largest youth organization in Shawano County, 4-H offers low-cost educational, social, personal development, leadership development and travel opportunities for youth in grades 5K - 13, as well as opportunities for adults. Note that all sessions described below are open to all youth (and adults) in unless otherwise noted. What a great way to try out some new project areas, and get a head start on projects that you have already selected for next year! (Non-registering parents/guardians may observe in most sessions - provided sufficient space is available in the room.)

Classes marked with: ** are <u>especially</u> for Cloverbuds (5K, Gr 1 and 2) * open to ALL members (5K-Gr 13)

If no * or **: Open to 3rd grade and older only, <u>unless grade requirement underlined in class description</u>

8:30AM Sessions:

- 1. Ceramic Pumpkin: Learn how to paint a ceramic piece using the drybrushing technique.
- 2. Cookie Decorating**: In this beginner cookie decorating class you will learn the basics of frosting and decorating sugar cookies. Each student will be able to take home cookies to enjoy!
- **3.** Greeting Card Making: Make and Take 4 greeting cards. We will be using rubber stamps & ink, as well as cutting tools. Each set of cards will be unique!
- 4. Fun With Pets*: Come learn about the pet project by talking about your pets or pets you like, hands on learning with pets, and learning fun pet facts.
- 5. **Pine Cone Owl:** You will leave with a cute little friend to take home. Please bring a hot glue gun if you have one. <u>5th</u> grade and older.
- 6. Recycling at its Finest**: Hands on chance to turn trash into treasure. You will be using what you usually throw away!
- 7. **Rubber Stamping and Papercrafting:** Explore the art of rubber stamping and paper crafting and create a project to take home.
- Shooting Sports: Try your hand at target archery and air rifle! No equipment necessary.....we'll have everything you need. Learn about wildlife, trees and birds in Wisconsin. <u>Not</u> open to 2nd year or beyond Shooting Sports project members.
- 9. Small engines: We will learn about internal combustion engines, engine types and components. Hands on!
- 10. Snowman Banner**: Using craft sticks and paints you get to make your very own snowman banner.
- 11. Wildlife**: Have you had your hands on a fox's fur or seen a bear track? Come to this hands' on session and get a chance to learn all kinds of fun facts about our local wildlife.
- 12. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA): is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. This course will satisfy the YQCA requirement to sell a livestock animal in the sale at the 2022 Shawano County Fair. There is a \$3 fee for each youth completing the course.

- 13. Ceramic Snowflake Ornaments**: Paint ceramic snowflake ornaments
- 14. **Cookie Cutter Easter Egg Wreath**:** using a cookie cutter, create your eggs out of colorful paper to build the wreath.

- 15. **Cupcake Decorating:** Learn how to fill and decorate cupcakes using various frosting tips and colors. Students will be able to take home cupcakes to enjoy!
- 16. Dog Project Info and More*: Learn about what this project is all about and have some fun in the process.
- 17. Greeting Card Making: Refer to the 8:30am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 18. Horse and horseless horse project members-Horseshoe Craft: Use paint, string & glue to create a horseshoe craft decoration. Wear clothing that can be soiled. Please bring along a horse shoe. Can be used but clean and nail holes must be clean too. Please bring along a hammer and pointed pliers if you have them.
- 19. Learning About Livestock Educational Credit: There is so much to learn in the livestock project area! Join us for this session which will be informative for younger members but still challenge even the most experienced exhibitor. This session will count for one educational credit.
- 20. **Poultry Informational:** This will be a general meeting that will discuss getting quality animals for fair, care of animals, fair information, project information for this year, and will be available for general questions.
- 21. Rubber Stamping and Papercrafting: Refer to the 8:30am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 22. Shooting Sports: Refer to the 8:30am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 23. Small engines: Refer to the 8:30am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 24. Votive Cup & Snowflake Ornament*: Using modge podge and tissue paper you will make a cute little cup to display.

- 26. Youth Mental Health for Those planning to be overnight Chaperones in 2022: gain skills to support youth when they are down, whether it's simply a bad day or it's more than that.

- 30. Ceramic Dragonflies: Learn how to finish a ceramic piece using rub on metallics.
- 31. **Electrical Wiring Basics:** In this hands-on session, you will learn how electricity comes to your home. You will also learn how to wire a wall switch, a wall socket and a light fixture. *Grade 5 and up.*
- 32. **Forestry Introduction:** Come learn what the Forestry program is all about. In this class we will talk about what is Forestry, tree and leaf identification, and how to determine the age trees. We will also discuss the many opportunities involved in this program.
- 33. **Needle Felting and Collections*:** Learn the process of needle felting while "painting with wool" and make a small picture. Learn the ins and outs of collections and how to display them.
- 34. **Rabbit Information*:** Going over etiquette for showmanship and how to do it, what to study, the process of showmanship.
- 35. Rubber Stamping and Papercrafting: Refer to the 8:30am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 36. **Shooting Sports:** Refer to the 8:30am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 37. Simple Sewing**: Learn how to do simple hand stitching
- 38. Small Engines: Refer to the 9:40am session for description. Repeat of the same session.
- 39. Get your Goat: Come and learn about goats and how to get started in this project.
