Fair Food Stand

This year the Leader's Inc. 4-H Group will be using SignUp Genius online registration so that individuals can register for shifts and duties. There will be no club lottery for the shifts. If your club wants to find some common times to work, you can contact folks to talk about preferences regarding desired shifts. Each family/person may sign up individually when the SignUp opens on June 1st. Please encourage your families to follow these directions. If it is difficult to sign up on the internet, folks may call the office at 715-526-6136 to claim a slot. When slots or shifts are claimed, they will disappear from the list. (This includes slots that you call in to claim during regular office hours. Our staff cannot make shifts appear that have been claimed in the schedule. Please be respectful to the staff member that helps you.)

Please note - the Food Stand Committee is asking adults to sign up in two special roles, Grill Master or Change Master, as well as "regular" volunteer shifts. This will enable people who want to operate the grill, or who are confident in making change, to do so. These positions also hold the most risk. Adults and older youth are encouraged to work and will do so both in the "back" making shakes, sandwiches, and nachos, and in the front taking and filling orders.

It is suggested there are 12 workers per shift. Here's an overview of the hours that the food stand will be open:








All Star Shoot

You are HIGHLY encouraged to complete your fair entry online.



NOTES FOR ALL:

Check the fair premium book carefully for complete rules, acceptable entries, age classes, etc.





If you plan to enter Showmanship in any department, be sure to list it on your entry sheet. If your CLUB is entering a booth or any other item in Dept. 132, please fill out a separate entry form with your CLUB name on it. Do not include CLUB entries under an individual exhibitor's name who has personal entries. ONLINE, use the individual option and create a personal profile. (Example: First Name-Bonduel, Last Name: 4-H Club)

IF YOU NEED TO COMPLETE A PAPER ENTRY:

This must be submitted to your Club Leader at your July meeting or prior to the August 1st deadline. We cannot accept fair entries after August 1st!

You will need to ask your club leader for a blank form and, if showing animals (beef, sheep, swine, dairy, or goat) you will also need an animal ID entry sheet to record additional information.

FAIR ENTRY PROCESSING FEES

Per Fair Board – A \$2.00 per entrant processing fee per exhibitor (excluding Cloverbuds) is due to the Extension Office by August 1 (\$5.00 for those with 51 or more entries). Talk to your club leader about how your club handles this as clubs should make one check to pay club member's processing fees. Checks should be made out to: Shawano Area Ag Society.

All 4-H Volunteer Leaders Need To Complete Form for Fair Pass Request

Each year, 4-H leaders may be honored with a seasonal fair pass on behalf of the Agriculture Society.

All 4-H leaders need to complete and return the form to receive a fair pass --- no exceptions.

Note that free fair passes are not awarded for simply turning in the form. A sufficient number of volunteer hours must be documented.

Return this form to your club general leader BEFORE AUGUST 1st. Club general leaders need to sign these forms and turn them in to the office for their respective club.

<u>County Planning Committee members only</u>: Please return your form directly to the Extension office.

Examples: new general leaders, someone who has started something new, or greatly improved an existing area, in your clubs. Also think about those you might see involved in a county planning committee.



Hall of Fame:

Individuals who made a significant contribution to the 4-H through years of dedication to our youth.

Leaders who have really had an impact on the members of our county, not solely within their club, by their passion for our programs & kids.

<u>Suggestion</u> of minimum of 20 years of service, including county as well as club level; can be given to past or current leaders while still living or posthumously.

To nominate someone for either award, submit volunteer's name with a brief description of what they've done, years of involvement, clubs, projects or areas they were involved in and, especially for the Hall of Fame award, contributions to 4-H on the county level. Nominations can be sent to the UWEX office. Or send an e-mail to terri.brunner@shawanocountywi.gov. Submissions are **due Aug 1**. Executive Board will make the final selection.
