



Strengthening Families Program Reduces Rates of Marijuana Initiation





Strengthening Families Program 10-14 Reduces Meth Use

(2 randomized studies of 1,300+ students in rural lowa)

Study 1: Among 12th graders who received SFP 10-14 in 6th grade, 0% reported meth use whereas 3.21% of the control group reported meth use



Strengthening Families Program 10-14 Reduces Meth Use

(2 randomized studies of 1,300+ students in rural lowa)

Study 2: Among 12th graders who received SFP 10-14 and Life Skills Training as 7th graders, 2.63% reported meth use whereas 7.61% of the control group reported ever using meth
