

Guidelines for Cyberbullying Online Course:

Overview: This self-paced course was developed to educate students on current digital citizenship research, multiple consequences of cyberbullying and methods for responsible reporting.

Objectives: By participating in the cyberbullying course, students will be given the opportunity to explore his/her values, beliefs and emotions surrounding cyberbullying, gain a better understanding of the implications of cyberbullying from multiple perspectives, and develop a personal action plan for addressing cyberbullying.

Time Limit: Approximately 75 minutes to complete however, there is no time limit. If you are unable to complete the course at one time you have the option to return to the point where you left off. To do so, access the course using the same computer and username. The course will automatically submit your responses, regardless if you are complete or not, after one week of inactivity.

Requirements: This course requires an internet connection and contains embedded video segments. If the video fails to load, copy and paste the URL provided into a new browser and watch the video on YouTube. *Please complete this same action for all video clips throughout the cyberbullying course.*


All questions have validation which requires the participant to complete the lesson before proceeding and some questions require correct responses. The course also requires students to complete demographic data questions that will be used only for UW-Extension to learn more about the impact of the course based on the youth participating and meet federal reporting requirements.
