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### **THREE GRANTS FUNDED INNOVATION IN 2024**

Thanks to a Wisconsin Sea Grant and Dean's Innovation grant, work began on the "Engaging Youth in Monitoring Aquatic Invasive Species using Environmental DNA (eDNA)" project. In summer, we hosted a Freshwater@ UW summer research student who collected and analyzed Wisconsin river samples for invasive carp eDNA. Thanks to a Wisconsin Idea Collaboration Grant and funding from the Wisconsin DNR, we partnered with staff from Madison School & Community Recreation and UW-Madison forest diversity researchers to develop, lead, and train staff on the use of fire in oak regeneration and measuring forest diversity. Finally, thanks to a Rural Partnerships Institute grant, work began on climate resiliency education for rural audiences and will continue through 2026.
