This fall's crazy weather has me thinking a lot about things my grandfather used to say; "Wind from the East, the weather is a beast" and "Clear moon, frost soon." When I was young, I used to laugh at him. As I have aged, I've come to recognize that there is some validity in such "old timer" sayings. Before we had smart phones to tell us the 10-day forecast, people had to listen to Mother Nature very carefully to predict the next day's temperature and precipitation. Of course, I had to Google it and I discovered:

"Wind from the west, fish bite the best; wind from the east, fish bite the least; wind from the north, do not go forth."

"Counting cricket chirps is said to foretell the days until first frost. As the temperature drops cricket chirping slows."

"Squirrel nest location is said to indicate type of winter. If nests are located high in the trees, the winter weather will be exceptionally harsh."
