Winter came with a vengeance recently - but what exactly is a Polar Vortex? "The polar vortex is a large area of low pressure and cold air surrounding both of the Earth's poles. It ALWAYS exists near the poles but weakens in summer and strengthens in winter. The term "vortex" refers to the counterclockwise flow of air that helps keep the colder air near the Poles. Many times, during winter in the northern hemisphere, the polar vortex will expand, sending cold air southward with the jet stream. This occurs fairly regularly during wintertime and is often associated with large outbreaks of Arctic air in the United States." Source: https://www.weather.gov/safety/cold-polar-vortex

It was definitely a cold spell! I filled my birdfeeders on Tuesday and by Thursday morning they were all nearly empty. Every morning there was a flurry of activity as finches, blue jays, cardinals, and downy and hairy woodpeckers visited the feeders and suet. How does wildlife survive such an arctic blast? Wild animals in Wisconsin are adapted to cold weather. Weaker animals die off every winter, generally about 30% every year. This provides food for predators and scavengers. Without this die off, the herbivores would quickly outstrip available food. Another interesting phenomenon created by cold and windy weather are ice formations on the shores of Lake Michigan.
