# 2019 State 4-H Hippology Contest May 4, 2019

# **UW – Marathon County Campus**

The Hippology contest will be run at the same time as the Horse Bowl contest, with Senior contestants completing Hippology prior to competing in Horse Bowl. Beginners and Juniors will be allowed to start the Hippology contest when all seniors have completed the Hippology contest. (approx. at noon)

Pre-registration for Hippology. See separate registration form.

**Cost:** \$6 per youth

**Divisions:** Beginner 3-5, Junior 6-8, Senior 9-13.

This is an educational activity of five or more horse related areas or stations. Contestants are given a score sheet and two minutes at each station to complete their answers.

A short written exam is required in the senior division. A "mini" written exam will be offered to Intermediates.

Counties do not enter contestants as a Hippology Team – the top individuals from each county will be designated as the team members and represent that county as a team. All individuals must preregister but do not need to pre-enter as a team.

Senior contestants MUST compete in the judging contest at Expo to be eligible for the Regional or National Hippology contests (including potential team alternates).

The Grand and Reserve county senior teams may be eligible for Regional and National contests. One additional state team may be eligible for the Regional contest.

HIPPOLOGY TEAM AWARDS WILL BE ANNOUNCED AT STATE EXPO ON SUNDAY.
