

Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference Call for Proposals



Annually, hundreds of 7th-10th grade youth come to the UW-Madison Campus to learn new ideas and skills, meet other youth from across the state, and experience college life.

Youth experience a variety of hands-on learning seminars focused on developing life-skills and developing career and personal interests.

Seminars are held throughout the UW-Campus and Madison, led by knowledgeable instructors in a variety of content areas. Participants also choose and complete a service project in partnership with a local community organization.

The conference is designed to engage participants in a learning environment that gives them a chance to explore the UW-Madison campus and interact with UW-Extension, UW-Madison faculty, and adult role models from around the state, to spend time investigating potential careers and to have fun.

Call for Seminars:

We are looking for seminar offerings that would appeal to 7th-10th grade youth and engage them in experiential learning in the area of the instructor's expertise. Adults and youth are encouraged to partner in teaching and facilitating seminars.

The content of the seminar may relate to one of the conference learning objectives:

- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math)
- Civic Engagement
- Healthy Living
- Life Skill Development (e.g. Communication, Leadership, Creativity, Social and Cross-Cultural Skills)
- Other Hands On Learning Opportunities

The size of the seminar is determined by the instructor and typically range from 10-30 participants. Limited funds are available to cover supplies.

All other logistics are planned by the state 4-H Youth Development office, including registration, Adult Advisors, and transportation. We are also happy to work with instructors to plan the seminar to engage the young people.
