I. What is Sustainability?

"Sustainable Development is development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. It contains two key concepts: the concept of needs, in particular the essential needs of the world's poor, and the idea of limitations...on the environment's ability to meet present and future needs." Source: The Brundtland Report, 1987

"In a sustainable society, nature is not subject to systematically increasing:

- a) Concentrations of substances extracted from the earth's crust (e.g. digging up and using too much fossil fuels, iron ore, minerals and metals)
- b) Concentrations of substances produced by society (e.g. pesticides, pharmaceuticals, fire retardants)
- c) Degradation by physical means (e.g. overharvesting forests and fisheries, turn open land into pavement)

And d) people are not able to meet their needs (e.g. drinkable water, housing, safe food, participation) Source: The Natural Step, http://www.naturalstep.ca/
