



## The Natural Step system conditions for a sustainable society

In the sustainable society, nature is not subject to systematically increasing

- 1. ... concentrations of substances extracted from the Earth's crust (such as heavy metals, fossil fuels, etc.)
- 2. ... concentrations of substances produced by society (such as plastics, toxic chemicals, etc.)
- 3. ... degradation by physical means (such as via erosion, or rapid depletion of unique ecosystems, etc.)

And in that society...

4. people are not subject to conditions that systematically undermine their capacity to meet their needs.



Guiding Objectives For A Sustainable Society, Based On The Natural Step Framework. Develop Policies And Practices That Ultimately:

- 1. Reduce dependence upon fossil fuels, extracted underground metals and minerals.
- 2. Reduce dependence on chemicals and other manufactured substances that can accumulate in Nature.
- 3. Reduce dependence on activities that harm life-sustaining ecosystems.
- 4. Meet the hierarchy of present and future human needs fairly and efficiently.
